Grading Criteria

The following is a brief summary of the grading criteria used in this course.

Grade: A

The student demonstrated an understanding of the assignment and applied creativity to their writing. The writing is both clear and effective.

There were no major grammatical or spelling errors. The completed assignment was also of appropriate length. If formatting requirements were present, the student did a good job of matching those requirements.

Grade: B

The student demonstrated some understanding of the assignment and applied some creativity to their writing. The writing is both clear and effective. There may be one significant moment of writing ambiguity or ineffective writing.

There may also be a small number of grammatical or spelling errors. The assignment may be a little too short, lacking important formatting, or miss requirements important requirements.

Grade: C

The student demonstrated a minimal understanding of the assignment and applied only marginal creativity to their writing. The writing is unclear at times.

There may also be a significant number of writing errors. Assignments that are too short, lacking important formatting, or miss requirements important requirements may get this grade if the writing is strong.

Grade: D

The student does not demonstrate an understanding of the assignment. Spelling and grammatical errors are obvious and demonstrate below average college writing skills.

Grade: F

Student did not hand the assignment in on time or failed to turn the assignment in at all. Documents not typed or not spell-checked will also receive this grade.
